I know I've also benefitted from treatment center meetings, including the recently reactivated one at Glen Oak hospital. I'm rerunning an article about that by Rich G and myself from a few years ago for further information.

Meeting Background and request for support

The Wednesday meeting on the psych ward at Glen Oak Hospital has reopened for in-person attendance. Outside attendees meet in the lobby inside the main entrance to the hospital at around 6:15 PM. The hospital is in Glendale Heights, on Winthrop, just off Glen Ellyn Rd. Rich G, the facilitator, describes the meeting thusly:

"We open the floor quickly after reading 'How it works ...' Just our presence there is a big boost for these people. I remember how I felt when I was a patient in a psych ward. I felt lost and Alone. I can see that look in the eyes and body language of the patients; and I feel good about sharing some of their pain and maybe offering them just a little bit of hope. Also, I remember when my friends from AA came to visit me; how happy that made me feel. There were no meetings in the psych ward back then, but I'm sure it would have helped."
