Were entirely ready to have God remove all these defects of character


#### **Tradition 6**

them just a little bit of hope. Also, I remember when my friends from AA came
to visit me; how happy that made me feel.
There were no meetings in the psych ward
back then, but I'm sure it would have
helped."
